

BRIGADIER GENERAL ANTHONY J. CARRELLI

The Adjutant General of Pennsylvania

Brigadier General Anthony J. Carrelli assumed duties as acting Adjutant General on January 14, 2016, and was confirmed by the Senate of Pennsylvania as the 53rd Adjutant General of Pennsylvania on June 29, 2016. In this cabinet-level position with the Pennsylvania Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, headquartered at Ft. Indiantown Gap, Annville, PA General Carrelli is responsible for the command, control and supervision of National Guard units – Army and Air – allocated to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, six state-owned veterans' homes and programs for Pennsylvania's one million veterans.



General Carrelli graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy with a Bachelor of Science Degree and was commissioned as a second lieutenant in 1985.

He served in the active duty Air Force for several years as a T-37, AT-38, and A-10 pilot. Following his release from active duty, General Carrelli joined the Pennsylvania Air National Guard where he served as commander of both the 111 Fighter Wing and the 171 Air Refueling Wing, and Deputy Adjutant General – Air, before assuming duties as Adjutant General. General Carrelli has deployed in numerous operations to include Desert Storm, Southern Watch, and most recently Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom.

COLONEL MICHAEL J. REGAN, JR.

Colonel Michael James Regan, Jr. is the Deputy Adjutant General – Air for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. He assumed his current duties on September 26, 2016.

He serves as the primary advisor to The Adjutant General on all matters pertaining to air operations and as the commander of the Pennsylvania Air National Guard. He is responsible for the overall operational readiness of the 4,100 assigned members and for ensuring that they are trained and equipped to successfully accomplish their federal and state missions.

Colonel Regan enlisted in the USAF in October 1981 and transferred to the 111th Fighter Wing, Pennsylvania Air National Guard in February 1984. He was an aircraft weapons specialist, QA specialist, Flight Chief and QA Chief. He attained the rank of Master Sergeant before being commissioned in 1994 as an Aircraft Maintenance Officer. He held positions as a Flight, Squadron and Deputy Group Commander before serving most recently as the 111th Mission Support Group Commander.



Colonel Regan has also served with the Michigan and Delaware Air National Guard. He has held various senior leadership roles in his civilian career, most recently as the Vice-President and Chief Information Officer at Lower Bucks County Hospital in Bristol, Pennsylvania. Prior to that he held various management positions during his fifteen years with Siemens Medical Solutions in Malvern, Pennsylvania. Most recently he was the Vice-President of Zone Services, responsible for the Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey regions. He was an adjunct professor of business management and technology at Ursinus College and at the West Chester University of Pennsylvania for over ten years. He was deployed to Southwest Asia for OPERATION SOUTHERN WATCH (1995), OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM (2003) and OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM (2008).

Colonel Benjamin (Mike) Cason is the wing commander of the 193rd Special Operations Wing, Pennsylvania Air National Guard, Middletown, Pennsylvania. Cason is responsible for the training and readiness of approximately 1,900 combat-ready Airmen and several EC-130J aircraft, which provide Military Information Support Operations, Electronic Attack, and Special Operations Forces Mobility in support of U.S. Special Operations Command and Air Force Special Operations Command. The wing also includes eight geographically separated units organized in a unique Regional Support Group construct that provides various expeditionary combat support capabilities to the U.S. Air Force, Air Combat Command, Air Force Space Command, the National Guard Bureau and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Cason graduated from The Citadel, Charleston, South Carolina, with a Bachelor of Arts degree, and was commissioned as a second lieutenant in 1990. Following undergraduate pilot training, Cason was stationed at McChord Air Force Base, Washington, flying the C-141B aircraft. He is a command pilot with more than 4,500 flying hours.

Col. Howard L. Eissler is Commander of the 111th Attack Wing, Pennsylvania Air National Guard, located at the Horsham Air Guard Station, Horsham, Pennsylvania.

Col. Eissler graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1987 with a Bachelor's Degree in Aeronautical Engineering and was commissioned as a second lieutenant the same year.

He completed undergraduate pilot training at Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas in 1988. Following his training, Col. Eissler was assigned to the 85th Flying Training Squadron, Laughlin AFB, Texas, where he served as a T-37 Instructor Pilot.

Col. Eissler began his tour with the 111th Fighter Wing in 1992 as an A/OA-10 Fighter Pilot. In 1999, he attended USAF Fighter Weapons Instructor Course at Nellis Air Force Base, Nevada, and served as the Squadron and Wing Weapons Officer from 1999 to 2003.

Colonel Gregg A. Perez is the commander of the 171st Air Refueling Wing, Pennsylvania Air National Guard, Coraopolis, to include the wing's geographically separated unit, the 258th Air Traffic Control Squadron, Johnstown, Pennsylvania. As wing commander, he administers and supervises the wing and its subordinate units, ensures combat readiness in the mobilization missions of units under his command and is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Air National Guard property and facilities at the Pittsburgh International Airport and the Johnstown-Cambria County Airport.

Colonel Perez entered the United States Air Force in September of 1987 when he was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant through Officer Training School at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas. Colonel Perez then attended Specialized Undergraduate Navigator Training at Mather AFB, California where he received his initial aeronautical rating as a navigator. Air National Guard as a member of the 112th Air Refueling Group of the 171st Air Refueling Wing located at Pittsburgh International Airport. In 1997, Colonel Perez attended Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training at Columbus AFB, Mississippi. He returned to the 171st Air Refueling Wing as a KC-135E/R pilot. Colonel Perez has accumulated more than 4,800 military flight hours and has held ratings to include; Senior Navigator, Instructor Navigator, Aircraft Commander, Instructor Pilot, Evaluator Pilot, and Command Pilot. He is also an experienced commercial pilot having flown the MD81/82, and the Airbus A319/320/321.

In 2007, Colonel Perez was selected as the Operations Officer for the 146th Air Refueling Squadron and subsequently in 2010 as Commander of the 146th Air Refueling Squadron. He was selected as Vice Wing Commander of the 171st Air Refueling Wing in 2013 and Wing Commander in 2015.
