### COLONEL SCOTT A. CORADI

Col. Scott A. Coradi is the Commander of the 111th Medical Group, Pennsylvania Air National Guard, located at the Horsham Air Guard Station, Horsham, Pennsylvania. As the Commander, Col. Coradi is responsible for the personnel and financial resources attached to the Medical Group. Additionally, he is responsible for the oversight of all assigned medical Units, ensuring each Unit remains fully mission capable and ready for response to both state and federal military operations. As the senior medical officer, he provides medical expertise to the Wing leadership.

Colonel Coradi enlisted in the United States Air Force as a firefighter in June 1988. He completed his initial firefighter training at Chanute Air Force base, graduating in August of 1988. While on active duty, he served during Operation Just Cause and Operation Desert Storm. Upon completion of his four-year active duty commitment, he enlisted in the New Jersey Air National Guard. While serving in the Air National Guard he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree, in Comprehensive Sciences, from Villanova University. Col Coradi was selected and commissioned in the Medical Service Corps in December 1995. Col Coradi completed his Health Services Administration training at Sheppard Air Force base in July 1996. He graduated from the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine, with a degree in Osteopathic Medicine, in June 2001 and entered the Medical Corps.



Colonel Coradi completed his residency in Emergency Medicine at Albert Einstein Medical Center, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in June 2005, serving his last year as Chief Resident. He is nationally board certified as a diplomat in the specialty of Emergency Medicine from the American Board of Emergency Medicine. In his civilian occupation, he practices emergency medicine and serves on several ad hoc committees for trauma and COVID-19 pandemic response. Prior to assuming command of the 111<sup>th</sup> Medical Group in October 2015, he served as the emergency physician with the 193<sup>rd</sup> SOMG, Det. 1, Chemical, Biological, Radiological/Nuclear, and Explosive Enhanced Response Force Package (CERFP).
