## **COLONEL TERRENCE L. KOUDELKA, JR.**

### **Vice Commander – 193d Special Operations Wing, Pennsylvania**

Colonel Terrence L. Koudelka, Jr. is the Vice Commander of the 193d Special Operations Wing, Pennsylvania Air National Guard, Middletown, Pennsylvania. As Vice Commander he is responsible for training and readiness of 1,900 combat-ready Airmen and seven uniquely modified EC-130J aircraft which provides Military Information Support Operations, Electronic Attack, and Special Operations Forces Mobility in support of USSOCOM and AFSOC. The Wing also includes eight geographically separated units organized in a unique Regional Support Group construct that provides various Expeditionary Combat Support capabilities to USAF, ACC, AFSAPCE, NGB and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Colonel Koudelka entered the United States Air Force in 1990 when he was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant through AFROTC Detachment 645. He completed Joint Specialized Undergraduate Navigator Training at both Randolph AFB, Texas and NAS Pensacola, Florida. He served nearly 11 years on regular active duty in both staff and flying assignments as a B-1B weapon Systems Officer (WSO). Colonel Koudelka's career includes participation in numerous combat operations while flying as aircrew in the B-1B and EC-130. He has deployed to numerous operations to include Operations SOUTHERN WATCH, ALLIED FORCE, SECURE TOMORROW, IRAQI FREEDOM, and ENDURING FREEDOM. In addition, his deployed experience includes several tours with US Army maneuver units as a parachutist qualified, Air Liaison Officer/Joint Terminal Attack Controller at the brigade, division and corps level.

# COLONEL (PA) JAMES G. MCCORMACK

## Land Component Commander – Army, Pennsylvania

Colonel James G. McCormack serves as the Land Component Commander for the PAARNG. His responsibilities include assisting The Adjutant General in supervision and management of the PAARNG and the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs. He represent TAGPA interests at all meetings, events, functions, ceremonies, and activities that fall within the purview of the Land Component Commander or which TAG is unable to attend.



Colonel McCormack provides command oversight for two JFHQ TDA elements; the JFHQ Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment and the Recruiting and Retention Battalion. Colonel McCormack manages and monitors select senior level programs, projects, and operational activities including the PAARNG Senior Service College Development Program that prepares and manages senior commissioned officers selected to attend the United States Army War College. He is an advocate for the PAARNG and its Soldiers and oversees the training, strength management, and readiness of the PAARNG. He ensures that the PAARNG is prepared to respond to state emergencies in a timely manner. He assist TAG in the response to state emergencies, disasters and disorder. Colonel McCormack plays an active role in any emergency in which the Pennsylvania National Guard is involved. He ensures that the PAARNG is ready and able to respond to federal missions, including deployment for war and other operational missions.

Colonel McCormack began his career as an enlisted infantryman in 1987. He later earned a commission through the Reserve Officer Training Corps in 1990. He has held numerous command and staff positions at the Company, Battalion, Regiment, and Joint Force Headquarters levels. Colonel McCormack served as the Deputy Garrison Commander and Director of Public Works of the Kabul Compound, the senior NATO headquarters at the time, in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in Kabul, Afghanistan in 2003-2004. He also served as the senior Intelligence and Operations Officer for 213<sup>th</sup> Area Support Group charged with general support logistic management and distribution throughout central Iraq, in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2007-2008.
