Governor Wolf,

Under the provisions of 51 Pa. C.S.A. section 901 and 1103, I am pleased to forward the nomination for promotion of Brigadier General Michael J. Regan, Jr., to Major General, General of the Line, in the assignment as a member of the Pennsylvania National Guard Headquarters Staff.

Brigadier General Michael James Regan, Jr. serves as the Deputy Adjutant General–Air and as the commander of the Pennsylvania Air National Guard. He has served admirably in this role since 26 September 2016. He is the primary advisor to The Adjutant General on all matters pertaining to air operations within the Commonwealth. He is responsible for the overall operational readiness of the 4,100 assigned members and for ensuring that they are trained and equipped to successfully accomplish their federal and state missions. General Regan represents our Commonwealth on the Air National Guard Strategic Planning System, helping to guide the long term future of the Air National Guard. He also serves in a primary leadership role in support of our State Partnership Program with Lithuania and recently graduated from the Senior Leader Course, Baltic Defense College, Vilnius, Lithuania.

Brigadier General Regan enlisted in the USAF in October 1981 and transferred to the 111th Fighter Wing, Pennsylvania Air National Guard in February 1984. He was an aircraft weapons specialist, QA specialist, Flight Chief and QA Chief. He attained the rank of Master Sergeant before being commissioned a Second Lieutenant in 1994 as an Aircraft Maintenance Officer. He held positions as a Flight, Squadron and Deputy Group Commander before his assignment as the 111th Mission Support Group Commander. General Regan also served with the Michigan and Delaware Air National Guard. He has held various senior leadership roles in his civilian career, most recently as the Vice-President and Chief Information Officer at Lower Bucks Hospital in Bristol, Pennsylvania. Prior to that he held various management positions during his fifteen years with Siemens Medical Solutions in Malvern, Pennsylvania. Most recently he was the Vice-President of Zone Services, responsible for the Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey regions. He was an adjunct professor of business management and technology at Ursinus College and at the West Chester University of Pennsylvania for over ten years. He deployed in support of Operations SOUTHERN WATCH, IRAQI FREEDOM and ENDURING FREEDOM.

Brigadier General Michael J. Regan, Jr. is the Deputy Adjutant General–Air for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. He assumed his current duties on Sept. 26, 2016.

He serves as the primary advisor to The Adjutant General on all matters pertaining to air operations and as the commander of the Pennsylvania Air National Guard. He is responsible for the overall operational readiness of the 4,100 assigned members and for ensuring that they are trained and equipped to successfully accomplish their federal and state missions.

General Regan enlisted in the Air Force in October 1981 and transferred to the 111th Fighter Wing, Pennsylvania Air National Guard in February 1984. He was an Aircraft Weapons Specialist, Quality Assurance Specialist, Flight Chief and QA Chief. He attained the rank of Master Sergeant before being commissioned in 1994 as an Aircraft Maintenance Officer. He held positions as a Flight, Squadron and Deputy Group Commander before serving most recently as the 111th Mission Support Group Commander.



General Regan has also served with the Michigan and Delaware Air National Guard. He has held various senior leadership roles in his civilian career, most recently as the Vice-President and Chief Information Officer at Lower Bucks County Hospital in Bristol, PA.
